Dear Parents/Carers.

Gospel Summary:

The crowd in this coming Sunday's Gospel showed faith in Jesus. They got into boats and traveled to find him. They called him *Rabbi, meaning "Teacher."* But at the same time, they had some doubts. They wanted some sign from Jesus that would prove once and for all who he was and what he could do. Jesus tells them again that the sign they seek is in their midst, for he is the bread sent from heaven. He is the bread of life.

Reflection for Parents

How many times has your child said to you, "Prove it to me"? And how many times have you yourself said the same? This is basically what the crowds are saying to Jesus - "Prove it to us." Give us a sign that we might believe in you." Every day God gives us signs that he loves us, cares for us, forgives us, and is with us. We see and hear these signs in creation, in the generous actions of a friend, in the kind words of a stranger, and in the community of believers that is the Church. Take time to reflect on the signs of God's love that you have seen or heard in recent days. Think about how you can be that sign in the week to come to others around you.

Phonological Awareness Activities for Chatter Matters:

Giving and listening to instructions;

One of the most rewarding learning experiences you can have with your child is while playing board or table top games. At least once week ask your child to drag out an old game. Pretend that you've forgotten how to pay the game and encourage your child to give you the instructions. Make sure you follow their instructions exactly as they say them, even if they are wrong. This way the child will realise they haven't given clear instructions and will need to adjust their language accordingly.

While in the car, accidentally forget which way you are going and ask your child to give you directions. Encourage them to use appropriate instructional language for example; turn left at the next traffic lights, drive 2 more blocks then turn right at the post office. They need to include the action word and key words that highlight where to go.

Thank you also to Fr Carey for his guidance with the students and families in the program and for conducting such a beautiful liturgy.



How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.



For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your 8.1 Windows Phone or Windows 8.1/10 Device
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- 7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

Lions Club Public Speaking Competition

Each year the Lions Club provides students in Grades 3-6 the opportunity to develop their skills in public speaking through participation in the Lions Club Junior Public Speaking Competition. We have a long history of involvement in this competition and look forward to each years topic arriving to start working on the process with the students.

Every year, each student in Grades 3-6 is expected to plan, write, practise and prepare a speech to present to their teachers and peers. This year the topics were:

Grade 3/4:

My Favourite Place - Where is your favourite place to go in your Community/Local Area? How did you find it? Describe it to us. Why do you like it? What makes it special to you? What do you do when you are there?

Grade 5/6:

You are a Travel Guide - Your job is to explore your local area - as if you've never seen it before! Document what you find. Tell us about your discoveries and why we should visit.

Every student presented their speech in the first week of school this term and as teachers we were all very impressed with the quality of speeches and the preparation that had occurred prior to and throughout the holidays. It made our job extremely difficult!!! Congratulations to all senior students, speaking in front of an audience is not an easy thing to do and you all did such a fantastic job!

From here we chose 6 students from 3/4 and 6 students from 5/6 (although Mr Mac chose 7!!! Too hard to choose!) to present their speeches to a panel of judges from the Parish - Tony Jones, Frances Walsh, Beryl Cooper and Sr Lucille. These students were:
