Reflection for Parents

Review the first list. Is God first in your order of importance? If not, what can you do to make faith in him an important priority in your life? Consider whether any other adjustments need to be made to your lists. Pray that the second list will help you be more aware of *wants verses needs*.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Ten activities will be provided during term 4 focusing on pragmatic language skills. Pragmatics refers to the social use of language and includes what we say, how we say it, our body language and whether it is appropriate to the situation.



1. It is crucial that your child has a solid perception of themselves. This self-awareness is a pre-requisite skill for well-developed social skills. Ask your child about the following information:

- Likes and dislikes
- Immediate and extended family, specifically relationships and what they mean
- Friends
- School life
- Other groups they belong to
- What they find easy and what they find difficult i.e. strengths and challenges

You might like to make an 'About me' book with you child. The ipad app Book Creator



would be ideal for this activity.
