Gospel Summary

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jn 10: 11-18, Jesus tells us that he is the Good Shepherd. He makes a distinction between good shepherds and hired hands. Good shepherds truly care for, guard, and protect their sheep. Hired hands are more likely to run at the first sign of trouble. As a good shepherd, Jesus knows his sheep and his sheep know him. Jesus is so devoted to his sheep that he will lay down his life for them.

Reflection for Parents

Think of all the people who share in the task of teaching, guiding, and protecting your child. Who among those people is truly a good shepherd—a person who invests himself or herself in your child's life? Who are the "hired hands"—those who are less personally invested, but are still a part of your child's circle of formation and care? Think about your own role as a parent. How are you being a good shepherd to your child and to your family? Are there any "wolves" in your life, drawing your attention away from the flock God has placed in your care?

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ANZAC DAY

ANZAC Day is one of Australia's most important National occasions. It marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War. Australians recognise the 25th of April as a day of national remembrance, which takes two forms. Commemorative services are held across the nation at dawn – the time of the original landing, while later in the day, former servicemen, servicewomen and their families meet to take part in marches through the country's major cities and in many smaller centres, like Rutherglen. ANZAC Day is a time at which all Australians stop and reflect on the many different meanings of war and conflicts that Australian servicemen and servicewomen have been involved in.

ANZAC Day March

Next Wednesday is ANZAC Day and we would like to encourage students to participate in the march. The ANZAC Day March begins at Jasper's Corner at 9.00am and heads up to the Rutherglen Memorial park where an ANZAC Day service will be held. Students wishing to represent our school in the march need to meet at Jasper's Corner in their **School Uniform** at 8.45 am. Katrina Bridge will be there to organise and help them lay the wreath.

To not only find out that our letters reached our soldiers but that they also were very appreciative of our messages was very special. It is such a great feeling to know that you have put a smile on someone's face by simply writing a letter. We have included a copy of the letter from Captain Brendan Kelleher.

Dear students from St Mary's Primary School,

My name is Brendan Kelleher and I am a Captain in the Australian Army, currently deployed overseas very far from Australia. I am writing to say thank you for all your letters. We received a lot of care packages over Christmas and I was very lucky to receive letters from some of the students in your class. In particularly I received letters from Emma, Aleisha, Georgie, Jazmyn, Felicity (and her dog Paws), and Jason, and would like to thank them all for writing to my soldiers and I.

As we are deployed all over the world sometimes letters and packages from schools might end up in two entirely different countries or might be delivered several weeks apart to members from different Army units. If there are other people in the class that have written, and have not heard back yet from a member of the Defence Force, I would like to thank them to!

Receiving mail is an exciting time for my soldiers and myself. While being deployed on operations can be an exciting experience, my soldiers and I love hearing about life back in Australia while so far away from our own families. This is particularly true over the Christmas and New Year's period which we spent away from our families, who we all miss very much. I hope you all had a merry Christmas and a happy New Years, and I hope Jo enjoyed going to the beach with her family.

I particularly liked sharing your drawings with the other soldiers in my platoon and we put them up around our accommodation so we could all look at them. Emma's drawing of her cat was particularly good.

Being in the Army is a very physically tough job. Mia-Leigh will be happy to know we play a lot of sport like AFL, cricket, and also a lot of basketball. Sport is a really great way to stay fit and make new friends, so we spend a lot of our free time playing it. While I do like swimming a lot, where we currently are there are not many swimming pools for us to use.

Finally good luck to Jason in his goal of joining the Defence Force. There are lots of very good jobs including Airfield Defence, but they all require people that work and study hard. I have found my time in the Defence Force to be very rewarding and fun, and I've made a lot of great friends.

In the last week of Term 1 David Williams, Education Officer - Digital Technologies from the Catholic Education Office presented a night 'Keeping Our Kids Safe Online'

As we shared last term the biggest message David shared with us **be proactive and be familiar with what** is available for your children, communicate and discuss what is happening online for them.... don't confiscate the technology!

David shared some questions that you could use to open the lines of communication with your children about their online use:

HOW MANY FOLLOWERS DO YOU HAVE?

OTHER THAN SOCIAL MEDIA WHAT ARE THREE APPS SITES YOU USE THE MOST?

WHAT TIME SHOULD EVERYONE IN THE HOUSE PUT THEIR TECHNOLOGY AWAY?

HOW DO YOU KNOW WHEN SOMETHING IS OK TO POST ONLINE?

WHAT DOES IT FEEL LIKE WHEN SOMEONE POSTS SOMETHING ABOUT YOU ONLINE?

HOW TO GET THE CONVERSATION STARTED

<u>Phonological Awareness Activities for Chatter Matters:</u>

Vocabulary/Morphology activities:

Find the synonym or antonym:



If your child has a set of spelling or tricky reading words she's working on this week, you can play games to build the words' meaning words. Decide whether the object of the game is to name antonyms or synonyms for the words. Once that is established, one player selects a word. Set a timer for one minute. See how many antonyms or synonyms each player can come up with in that time. For example: humid – muggy. Close, steamy, oppressive, stuffy. Discuss tricky word meanings and try to put them into meaningful sentences. You could use pen and paper, and ask each player to write their words down.
