Welcome Back & Here We Go Again & Again & Again:

Welcome back to a wet start to the term. Again we are in the midst of another challenging Covid period with a 5 day lockdown. However I'm confident that as a school community we can again meet any COVID obstacles thrown our way. As in previous lockdowns I will keep you up to date with the latest COVID restrictions that will affect our school. Please be aware of all the up to date COVID restrictions when entering school grounds and dropping off and picking up students. Again masks are to be worn when entering school grounds.

Important COVID Reading Below:

Please read the next 3 pieces of COVID information regarding **QR codes, Management of an Unwell Student or Staff Member & Stay Home When Unwell.**

I have cut and pasted straight out of the Schools Operation Guide, Term 3 2021 (from 9 July) that all schools have to follow.

QR Codes Check in

QR code check ins are mandatory & required to be used by:

- all visitors on school site (including contractors, MACS and other external staff and building and maintenance staff)
- all parents who enter school buildings when on school site

QR code check ins are not required to be used by:

- staff
- students
- parents who come onto school grounds for drop off or pick up, but do not enter buildings.

Management of an unwell student or staff member

It is important that any student (or staff member) who becomes unwell with COVID-19 symptoms while at school gets tested and returns home.

The symptoms to watch out for are:

- loss or change in sense of smell or taste
- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose



Some people may also experience headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea. Staff or students experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should be advised to get tested and stay home until they receive a test result.

Stay home when unwell

The most important action school communities can take to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19 is to ensure that any unwell staff and students remain at home and get tested, even with the mildest of symptoms.

Students with underlying conditions (such as hay fever or asthma)

If a student has persistent symptoms due to an underlying condition such as hay fever or asthma, the student should still be tested for COVID-19 if they develop symptoms that are different to or worse than their usual symptoms. Students whose symptoms are clearly typical for their underlying condition can continue to attend school. Parents/carers should also consider getting a medical certificate from the child's treating GP to confirm that it is safe for them to attend school with persistent symptoms that may overlap with some of the symptoms of COVID-19 such as cough or runny nose.

Young children with persistent mild symptoms

For younger children (in Prep to Year 2) who have had a negative COVID-19 test that was taken after they developed symptoms, the decision about return to school should be made in conjunction with the child's treating GP. If the GP is satisfied the child has recovered from their acute illness, is otherwise well and does not need a repeat COVID-19 test, the child can return even if they are not completely free of symptoms. Any worsening of symptoms will require review and repeat COVID-19 testing, if considered appropriate by the doctor.

Students with a negative COVID-19 test whose symptoms have completely resolved do not need a medical certificate to return to school.

Teachers will organise skipping activities during the school day. If your child is a keen skipper, encourage them to skip at home too to earn more badges, faster.

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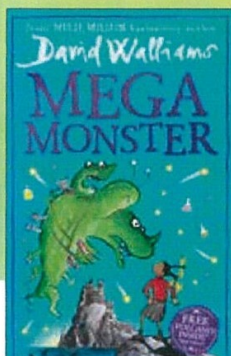
