COVID Restrictions and Updates:

Face masks

Please see coronavirus.vic.gov.au for the latest face mask requirements.

For all school settings, the Victorian Chief Health Officer:

- Directs school staff and secondary school students aged 12 or older must always wear a face mask indoors and outdoors at school, including when attending an Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) program, unless a lawful exception applies.
- Directs school staff and secondary school students aged 12 or older must always wear a face mask when travelling to and from school on public transport, taxis or ride share vehicles.
- Directs school staff must wear face masks while teaching wherever practicable, except where removal of a face mask is necessary for effective communication.
- Directs students in Year 3 to Year 6 to wear face masks when indoors on school premises, unless an exception applies.
- Recommends that all other children wear face masks when at school, attending an OSHC program, or when travelling to and from school on public transport, taxis or rideshare vehicles.

Important for Years 3 – 6 Students:

It was great to see students at school throughout the week, even though it was staggered. The same for this coming week with the Grade 3&4 required to be at school on Tuesday and Wednesday and the Grade 5&6 students on Thursday and Friday. Then set for a full return on Tuesday the 26th of October.

Masks & QR Check In:

All parents, unless you have a medical exemption, are required to wear a mask on school grounds. You have to QR code checkin if you enter any room of the school. Every door has a QR code sign.

Drop Off & Pick:

All parents and carers have been great in this area. Please just drop off and pick up your child from the rear car park. This system is working well. Only enter the school grounds if absolutely necessary.

Squid Game:

As most of you would be aware after our post on our Facebook page during the week parents and guardians need to be diligent with what your children are watching and it is strongly advised that

primary school children and early teens do not watch Squid Games on Netflix as it is very violent and inappropriate for their age group.



Sick Children:

A reminder students, even with the mildest symptoms, of a cold, running nose, cough etc are not to be at school.

If a student does present to school with these symptoms we will have to send them home.


Pupil Free Days This term

An Echidna visited our school on Wednesday

echidna, (family Tachyglossidae), also called **spiny anteater**, any of four species of peculiar egg-laying mammals from Australia, Tasmania, and New Guinea that eat and breathe through a bald tubular beak protruding from a dome-shaped body covered in spines. Echidnas have beady eyes and mere slits for ears, and at the end of their beaks are two small nostrils and a tiny mouth. Electroreceptors in the skin of the beak may sense electrical signals produced by the muscles of invertebrate prey. Echidnas can be active day or night, probing along the ground slowly and deliberately as they search for prey, but they will shelter themselves from extreme midday heat in burrows or caves. Like their relative the platypus, echidnas have an unusually low but variable body temperature of 29-32 °C (84-90 °F) and cannot tolerate more extreme heat. In spite of echidnas' outward resemblance to hedgehogs, the two animals are not related and belong to separate mammalian orders. Echidna species can be distinguished by their spines, by the number of claws on their feet, and by the shape and length of the beak.
