### **IMPORTANT**

#### **Absenteeism - Our Legal Requirement**

It is a **legal requirement** that **all school**s must follow up any daily **unexplained absences by 9.30 am**.

If your child is going to be away from school or arriving late for any reason the school **must be notified.** The simplest way to do this is through **PAM.** 

If your child is an **unexplained absence** you will receive an **SMS** asking you to contact the school and a phone call if necessary. If there is no answer then the **emergency contacts** for your family will be contacted and then if there is still no answer the police are contacted. These steps are followed to ensure that we know that your child is **safe.**

### 2023 Camps, sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

The Application Forms for the above fund have been put in the tubs for the oldest sibling to take home.

Below is an excerpt regarding Eligibility, for your information. If eligible, please return the signed application form to the front office as soon as possible.

#### **CSEF** eligibility

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or
- on the first day of Term two.
  - a) Be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards **OR** be a temporary foster parent, and
  - Submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (<u>CSEF</u>): <u>Policy | education.vic.gov.au</u>

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

#### Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for:

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

#### Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).



#### **Values for Australian Schooling**

Good citizenship values and models responsible behaviour, attitudes and democratic values.

Good citizenship requires knowledge of a society's major social, political and legal institutions, the capacity and disposition to participate within those institutions, and an awareness of the rights and obligations that citizenship entails. It requires involvement in the civil life of a community whether through formal participation, such as standing or voting in elections for public bodies, or working individually or collectively to build stronger, inclusive and sustainable communities.

#### **Democratic values**

Values such as respect and 'fair go' are part of Australia's common democratic way of life. They reflect our commitment to a multicultural and environmentally sustainable society where all are entitled to justice.

**Nine Values for Australian Schooling** have emerged from Australian school communities and from the *National* **Goals for Schooling in Australia in the Twenty-First Century**. They are presented below in alphabetical order and not in any rank order of importance.

You can easily see how our key PBIS beliefs of **Respect Yourself, Respect Others and Respect Our Environment** sit comfortably alongside these 9 values.

#### **Nine Values for Australian Schooling**

- **1. Care and Compassion.** Care for self and others.
- 2. **Doing Your Best.** Seek to accomplish something worthy and admirable, try hard, pursue excellence.
- 3. **Fair Go.** Pursue and protect the common good where all people are treated fairly for a just society.
- 4. **Freedom.** Enjoy all the rights and privileges of Australian citizenship free from unnecessary interference or control, and stand up for the rights of others.
- 5. **Honesty and Trustworthiness.** Be honest, sincere and seek the truth.
- 6. **Integrity.** Act in accordance with principles of moral and ethical conduct, ensure consistency between words and deeds.
- 7. **Respect.** Treat others with consideration and regard, respect another person's point of view.
- 8. **Responsibility.** Be accountable for one's own actions, resolve differences in constructive, non-violent and peaceful ways, contribute to society and to civic life, take care of the environment.
- 9. **Understanding, Tolerance and Inclusion.** Be aware of others and their cultures, accept diversity within a democratic society, being included and including others.
