Yesterday was the First Sunday of ADVENT



Advent is the Catholic liturgical season of preparation leading up to Christmas Day. The word *advent* is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, which means *coming*. During Advent we anticipate the coming of Jesus as a baby. It's a time full of reflection, excitement, and hope as we prepare to celebrate his birth. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance and fasting are appropriate during this season.

Advent officially begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on December 24. It marks the beginning of the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar year. This year Advent begins this Sunday, December, 3. Christmas Eve is the Fourth Sunday of Advent, with Christmas falling on a Monday. Four weeks isn't long, but that still leaves plenty of time to spend some quiet time preparing for Jesus' coming.

Having an **Advent Wreath** in your home is a great way of tracking yourselves meaningfully through Advent. Don't let the Advent wreath become just another tradition without any meaning behind it! Make lighting the Advent Wreath a time for meaningful connections and discussions with your loved ones.



Week 1: Advent Wreath Prayer:

Dear Jesus, you are the hope in our messy world. As we light the first candle this Advent, help us slow down, listen to your voice, and focus on what's really important. We place our hope in you as we prepare our hearts to celebrate your birth on Christmas. Amen.


